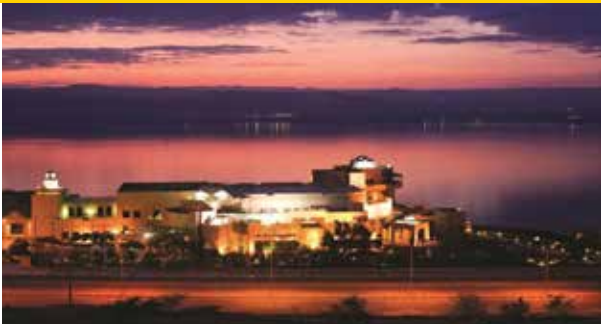

Diverse attractions and a well-established business infrastructure position the Hashemite Kingdom as a competitive destination for meetings, incentives, conferences and exhibitions in the region. As the sector continues to grow, accounting for an ever-expanding share of the global travel market, companies are seeking out new overseas sites to host their meetings, conferences and events. Regional and international groups are increasingly looking to Jordan as a desirable destination in the Middle East to host their events.

In addition to targeting business from sectors that build on Jordan’s existing strengths, including the medical field, the pharmaceutical industry, humanities and religious studies, and information technology, the kingdom has earmarked regional associations and not-for-profit events as an additional area for future focus. Healthcare & Pharmaceuticals

A significant number of Jordan's healthcare institutions are internationally accredited and Jordan is the first country in the region to be awarded three accreditation certificates by the International Society for Quality in Healthcare (ISQua). The Health Care Accreditation Council (HCAC) is the only non-profit ISQua accredited institution, in Jordan and the region, which is dedicated to improving the quality of health care services and promoting patient safety through accreditation, consultation and capacity building.



The Al Hussein Medical Centre's National Centre for the Rehabilitation of Amputees is the only facility in the region to introduce the 'multi-movement' upper prosthetic limb. It also developed the industry of state of-the-art 'smart' prosthetic limbs and chiropractic devices engineered with the use of computer-aided design and manufacturing technology.

Jordan is considered a regional leader in medical tourism and hosts more than 250,000 healthcare patients from neighboring countries each year.

Jordan has earned its leading position in medical tourism due to several factors:

- Highly qualified personnel in the disciplines of nursing, medicine, pharmacy, medical engineering, etc.
- High quality of medical services
- Use of advanced medical technologies
- Provision of latest medical devices and diagnostics equipment for treatment and advanced radiology centers, laboratories, oncology centers and nuclear medicine, etc.

The pharmaceutical sector in Jordan holds a reputable and leading position in the country's prosperity and development as it contributes significantly to the country's GDP and has a substantial share of the total national exports.

Jordan exports %80 of the medicine it produces to Arab markets, a smaller portion reaches western countries such as the UK and USA.

Jordan Medical Association:

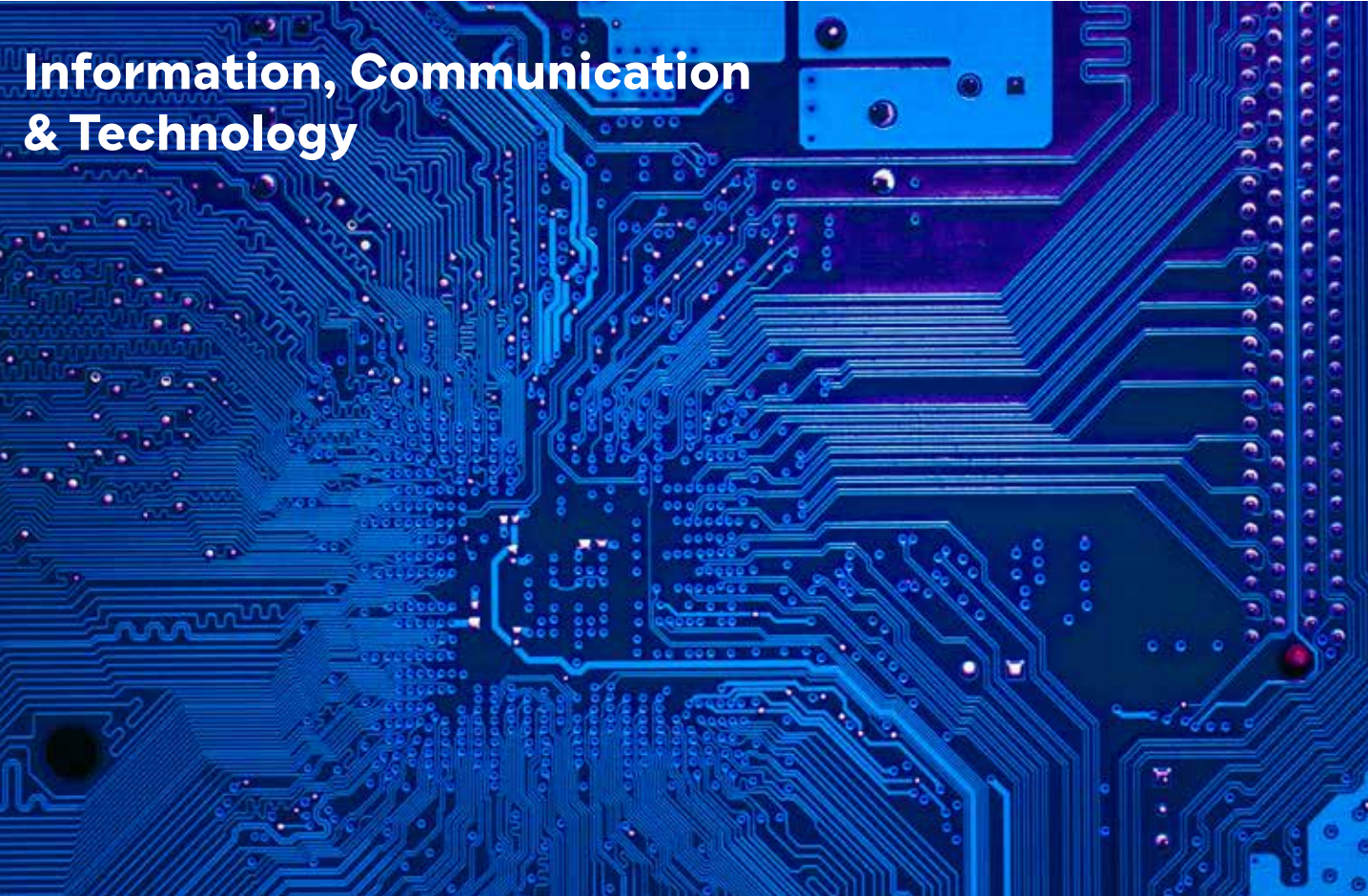
The Jordan Medical Association was established in 1954 and is one of the oldest professional federations in Jordan. It has 41 medical associations under its wing.

Jordan Pharmacists Association:

The Jordan Pharmacists Association was established in 1957 and more than 17,400 pharmacists are members.

Eastern Mediterranean Public Health Network (EMPHNET): EMPHNET was officially established in Jordan as a collaborative platform dedicated to promoting public health in the Eastern Mediterranean region, with specific focus on the field of epidemiology.

Key Business Sectors in Jordan



Innovation is the lifeblood of the Jordanian economy, as evidenced by small- and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs), which account for 95 percent of the country's economic activity.

With Jordan's ICT sector hosting more than 600 active technology companies (including 300 start-ups) and several of the highest performing U.S. based firms, like Microsoft, the country is working to developing the sector into a regional ICT hub in the Middle East. Currently, Amman is the 10th best place in the world to start an IT company.

The ICT sector accounts for approximately 12% of GDP and has generated over 84,000 jobs. It attracts an average of USD 150 million in annual investments.

Among the three categories in the ICT sectors (IT industry, telecom, BPO industry), competition is at its strongest in broadband and mobile markets. Due to an ICT-focused education system, low start-up costs and business friendly environment, Jordan has earned the reputation of a regional tech start-up hub. Its growing online market is increasingly attracting international capital.

Orange, Zain, and Umnia are the dominant mobile phone providers, reaching 6.6 million mobile phone subscribers, reflecting a 108% penetration rate with 3G coverage reaching 98% of the population. Internet and Wi-Fi access is readily available throughout the country with fiber optics spreading exponentially.

REACH 2025 is an initiative launched in 2016 to revolutionize the digital transformation of the Jordanian economy. Reach 2025 aims to empower the community, all sectors and businesses to raise productivity and guarantee growth and prosperity by boosting the digitalization of key sectors like health, energy and cleantech, education, finance, transport, communications and security.

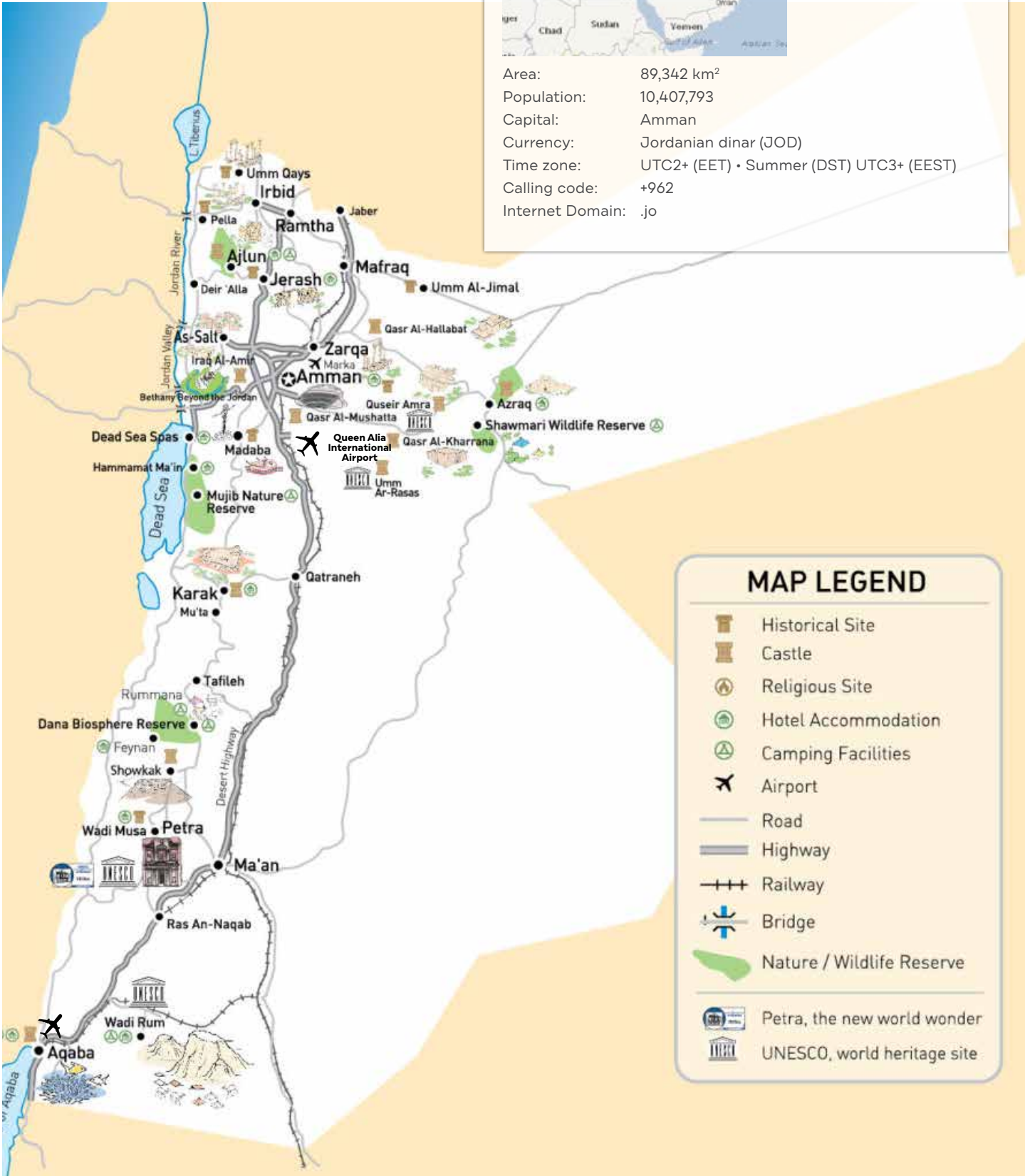

Why Jordan?

A Scientific Hub

With an impressive 2000 researchers per 1 million people, Jordan has one of the highest rates of per capita expenditure on research and development within the region according to The World Bank. Science and research are critical to evolving the innovation culture in Jordan, and there are countless research centers in the country, which operate in the fields of energy, medical, technology, and nanotechnology, among others. Graduates in scientific studies constitute more than 40% of total graduates from Jordanian universities. Jordan is constantly increasing the impact of the research sector on the economy by developing its research infrastructure, and transferring knowledge and technology between science and business.



Hospitals



There are 117 hospitals in Jordan (August 2019), which offer services to Jordanian and non-Jordanian patients. This includes 69 private hospitals, 31 government hospitals, 15 royal medical services hospitals and 2 university hospitals. These hospitals offer facilities for a range of medical specialties, including cardiovascular diseases, neurosurgery, orthopedics, pediatrics, cancer treatment, infertility, ophthalmology, beauty, psychiatry, addiction, and others.

On average, for every 10,000 Jordanians there are 28.6 doctors (one of the highest rates in the world), 32 nurses, 17.8 pharmacists and 10.4 dentists.

Research centers



Jordan is proudly home to numerous research centers, including:

- The Royal Scientific Society:**
The largest applied research institution, consultancy, and technical support service provider in the country, RSS is a regional leader in the fields of science and technology. Supported by more than 500 science specialists, researchers, technical support staff, highly skilled management, and faculty, RSS has become recognized as a local, regional and international research and development hub.
- The National Energy Research Center (NERC):**
NERC is one of the specialized technical centers of the Royal Scientific Society (RSS) for research, development and training in the fields of new and renewable energy. It consists of four specialized divisions: the Wind Energy Division; Photovoltaic Division; Energy Efficiency and Solar Thermal Division; and Oil shale and Bioenergy Division.
- SESAME:**
The Middle East's first major international research center is an intergovernmental scientific and technological center that is open to all scientists from the Middle East and elsewhere.
- The National Center for Research and Development (NCRD):**
NCRD aims to develop scientific capabilities in the areas of nanotechnology, biotechnology, energy, Badia research and any other research interest of importance to Jordan.

One of the kingdom's premier venues is the King Hussein Bin Talal Convention Centre. Located on the shores of the Dead Sea, this enormous structure offers 24,000 square meters of meeting and event space. It houses 25 conference halls in addition to lounges, foyers and outdoor spaces.

Several hotels across the kingdom also offer conference facilities, along with a variety of ballrooms, business centers and function rooms that cater for both large and small gatherings. Whether choosing a hotel facility or one of the stand-alone conference venues, planners can benefit from the support of on-site destination management companies and professional

conference organizers that have longstanding experience in hosting events in Jordan.

The level of support can be tailored to the requirements of each event, from overseeing key requirements, such as catering and accommodation, to managing every detail down to delegate gifts and signage. Intellectual Exchange



Our human capital has always been a distinguished asset within the region. Our most valuable strength is the creative, intellectual and hard-working minds of the Jordanian people. Jordan proudly boasts its determination to take the needed steps to capitalize on human potential by investing heavily in education. Take the opportunity to meet and interact with sources of great talent and knowledge that can be found across the different communities, be it in academic, cultural or professional institutions.

Jordan accounts for over 23 percent of tech entrepreneurs in the MENA region. Its ICT sector comprises more than 600 active technology companies (including 300 start-ups) with 16,000 jobs in the IT sector. This puts Jordan well on its way to becoming the regional tech hub of the Middle East.

The highly skilled workforce of the healthcare sector consists of over 57,000 well-trained medical staff. Jordanian professionals in the healthcare sector are also highly sought after as a result of their strong education, training, qualification, and creativity. Jordan has the largest pool of physicians, dentists, and nurses per capita compared to the region.

Awe-Inspiring Authenticity



There is no mistaking the fact that Jordan is a kingdom steeped in history and culture. From the moment of arrival, a sense of its rich heritage embraces any visitor. You are surrounded by remnants of ancient civilizations long since passed, which remain stamped into the very fabric of this amazing kingdom and etched into the soul of the people who live here. From the Greeks, Romans and the mysterious Nabateans, to the Byzantines, Islamic Khalifates, and

the Ottoman Empire, the authenticity and captivating heritage of this land takes you on an inspirational journey back in time. Discover the Greco-Roman ruins of Jerash in the north, which are considered to be the best-preserved Roman ruins outside of Italy. Explore the famous 'rose-red city' of Petra in the south, a world wonder and marvel as supported by the testimony of all who get the chance to visit it.

Sustainability

Jordan is ranked second in the region with regards to renewable energy generation. In terms of renewable energy growth, Jordan placed first regionally and third globally and is the third best host for green energy projects according to the Bloomberg Climatescope index. From waste-to-energy projects such as bio-gas electricity generating at Al-Ghabawi Landfill to the National Green Growth Plan, which lists 24 current projects in six sectors (water, energy, agriculture, waste management, transport and tourism), sustainable development has been a key goal in Jordan and is advancing at a rapid pace; there are more than 365 companies operating in the clean technology and renewable energy field in Jordan. The Ministry of



Environment is executing two strategic projects ('Adaptation to Climate Change to Sustain Jordan' and 'Comprehensive management system on PCBs'), which aim to provide the necessary tools to increase technical capacity in Jordan to meet the requirements of the Stockholm Convention. The overall objective is to safeguard the environment and health from the impact of polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs) at the national and global levels.

Entry to Jordan

Some visitors to Jordan need a visa to enter the country and this can be obtained upon arrival for multiple nationalities. The list of restricted nationalities that require approval prior to arrival can be found at: <http://moi.gov.jo/Pages/viewpage.aspx?pageID=196>

1. Cost of visa to Jordan:

Single entry visa valid for one month	JD40 (approximately USD 56)
Double entry visa valid for 3 months	JD60 (approximately USD 85)
Multiple entry visa valid for 6 months	JD120 (approximately USD170)

2. Jordan Pass

The Jordan Pass provides hassle-free entry to more than 40 of Jordan’s tourist attractions, including Petra, Jerash, Wadi Rum, and more. The pass includes the cost of a tourist entry visa (pass holders are exempt of visa fees if they stay a minimum of three nights (4 days) in Jordan). 3. Online visa application form and expedited visa

As part of the Jordan Convention Bureau's support, visa facilitation is extended for restricted nationality delegates of regional and international meetings held in Jordan.

International Transportation

Queen Alia International Airport (QAIA)

Situated 35 kilometers from the heart of Amman, the Queen Alia International Airport was inaugurated in 1983 to become Jordan’s gateway to the world. The airport provides passenger services, air cargo and aviation support services. In 2018, Queen Alia International Airport won best airport by size and region: Middle East for airports serving 5-15 million passengers annually, according to the Business Year Magazine. The airport serves 74 directs lines. In 2018, 8.4 million passengers arrived in Jordan through QAIA.

As a host government, Jordan has a dedicated VIP lounge that offers the needed services for VIP visitors, such as governors, heads of state, ministers and others.

Royal Jordanian

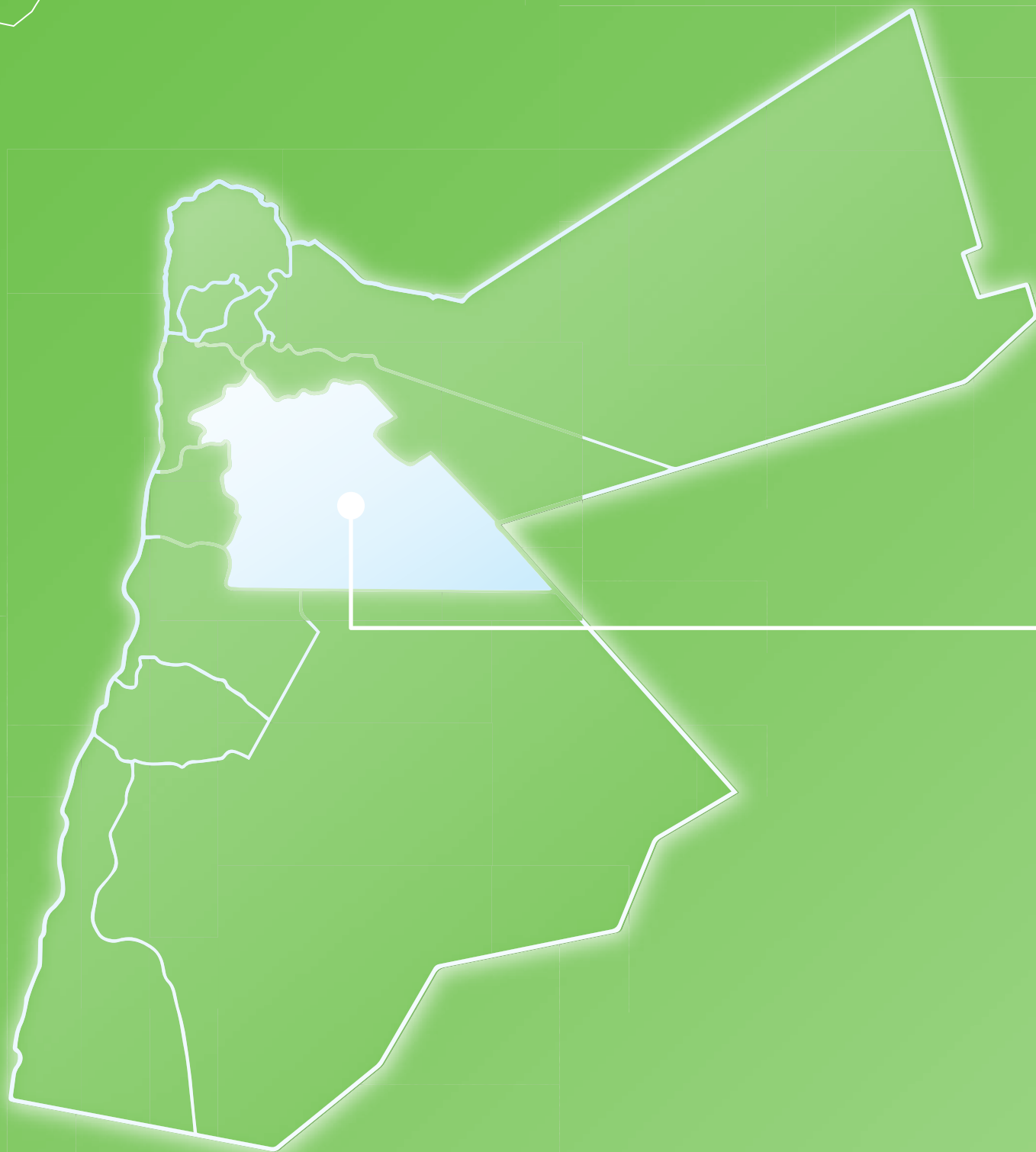
Royal Jordanian (RJ) is the national carrier of the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan. It was established in 1963 and has been an essential contributor to the country’s economy, bringing in hard currency and playing a key role in attracting tourists from around the world. It contributes to 3% of the country’s GDP.

The vision of Royal Jordanian is “To be the airline of choice connecting Jordan and the Levant with the world”. The airline links Jordan to 56 direct destinations across four continents on its 27 highly equipped aircrafts. Royal Jordanian joined the One World Airline Alliance in 2007. The 14 international RJ partners that are members in the alliance connect RJ passengers to more than 1,000 cities in 150 countries to and from Amman with one stop.

Other Airlines

The Airport International Group (AIG), the managing company for Queen Alia International Airport, has a route development plan in place to expand airline access to and from Jordan. There are currently more than 30 international flights connecting Jordan to different destinations worldwide. Low cost carriers such as Ryanair, British EasyJet airlines, Norwegian airlines, and a Russian airline operate to and from Jordan.

ACROSS AMMAN

Jordan's cosmopolitan capital is a hub for business and commerce in the region. Amman's appeal as a destination for Meetings, Incentives, Conferences and Exhibitions is enhanced by several factors. Its strategic location and liberal outlook have attracted many multicultural corporations that have established offices in Amman, including Oracle, Cisco and Expedia. Microsoft also added a Customer Service and Support Hub in Amman, making it the company's second global setup in Jordan, the first being the Enterprise Services Hub. The fast-growing economy contributes to the climate of expansion in the city, and the increased effort on the part of the Jordan Convention Bureau to promote the city's business-friendly environment and publicize its sizeable selection of world-class venues has helped establish Amman as a popular business events destination in the Middle East. According to the ICCA



rankings report for 2018, Amman is ranked second in the Middle East in terms of the number of international association conferences and meetings hosted. It is one of the most visited cities in the Arab world and is also a major destination for tourism in the region. In 2018 there were 3.2 million overnight visitors to Amman. This number is forecast to grow over the coming years, fueling the city's impressive catalogue of business and leisure attractions.

INTELLECTUAL CAPITAL

Without a doubt, Amman's most prized resource is its knowledgeable human capital. Try mansaf, the national dish of Jordan, a traditional dish comprised of tender lamb steeped in a fermented yoghurt sauce and served on a bed of fragrant rice or bulgur.

Another Jordanian favorite is mamlouba, a savory bake of chicken, eggplant and rice infused with Middle Eastern spices.

Jordanians have a sweet tooth, which is reflected in a wide array of delicious desserts, from kunafa – a syrup-soaked cheese pastry to harissa, a sticky semolina cake drenched in honey and sprinkled with nuts.

The Citadel
Towering above the city from atop Jabal Al-Qala'a, the Citadel is the site of ancient Rabbath-Ammon. Excavations here have uncovered Roman, Byzantine and early Islamic remains. The most impressive of these is known simply as Al-Qasr (the palace) and dates from the Islamic Umayyad period. Ruins of Umayyad palace grounds lie nearby.



Café culture: Rainbow Street
Restaurants, bars and hole-in-the-wall art galleries line the bustling Rainbow Street, which is a hub for entertainment and dining in Amman.



Roman Amphitheater
The restored theatre is one of the most impressive remnants of Roman Philadelphia. Seating 6,000 people, the amphitheater is cut into the northern side of a hill. It was built around the 2nd century AD during the reign of Antoninus Pius. A small shrine above the top rows once held a statue of the goddess Athena. Today the theatre is used for entertainment, concerts and other events, gathering thousands of people in the heart of Amman.



Artistic flair: Jabal Weibdeh
This up-and-coming neighborhood is undergoing rapid gentrification. It hosts artsy cafes and restaurants-cum-galleries.

Nearby Attractions

The Roman ruins of Jerash

Just a 40 - minute drive from Amman, Jerash is home to one of Jordan's most impressive historical sites. The immaculately preserved ruins in Jerash are considered among the best outside of Rome and stand testament to the city's occupation since the Bronze Age. In Roman times, the ancient city was called Gerasa. The lovingly restored Hadrian's Gate was erected to honor the visit of Roman Emperor Hadrian to the city in the year 129, and it provides an imposing entryway into the ancient city. The path leads to the hippodrome, which was built between the 1st and 3rd centuries. Further on is a columned high street, still scored with the marks of many chariots, that opens out into a spacious plaza, the central forum for residents of the ancient city. Other highlights include two vast amphitheaters, several temples and the elegant Nymphaeum, an ornate fountain adorned with



carved lion heads and sculpted Corinthian columns. It takes approximately three to four hours to explore the ruins at leisure, although a quick tour can be managed in two hours. A short drive from the site is the Lebanese House restaurant, one of Jerash's top dining venues with plenty of space for large groups and a menu of excellent Arabian dishes.

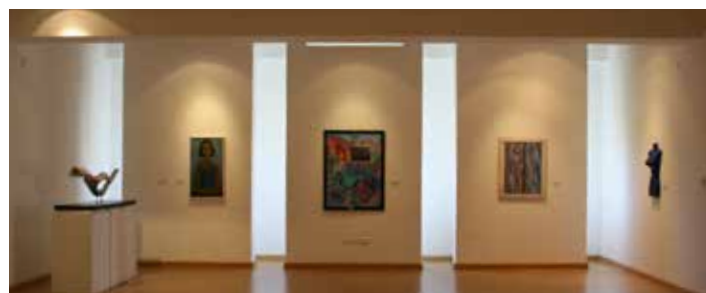

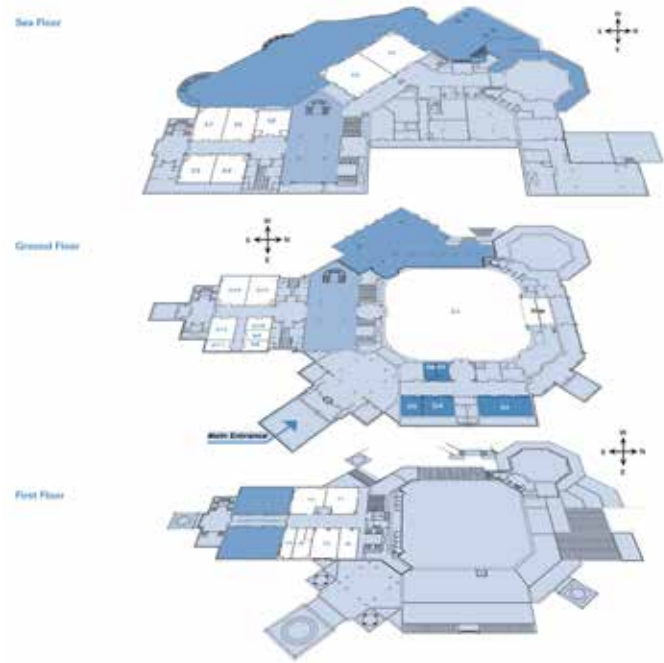

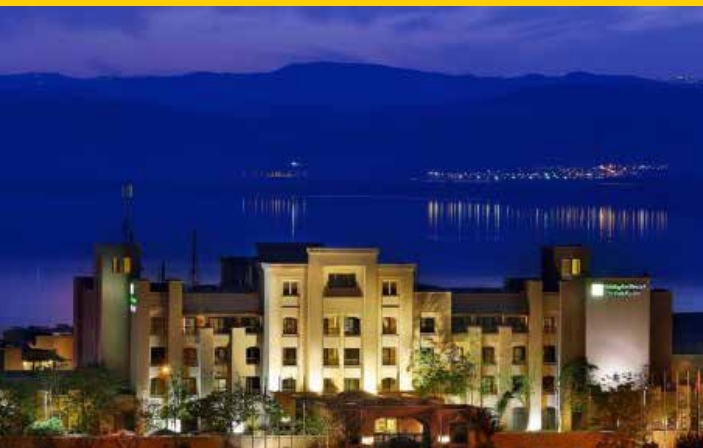

Hammat Zarqa Ma'in Hot Springs

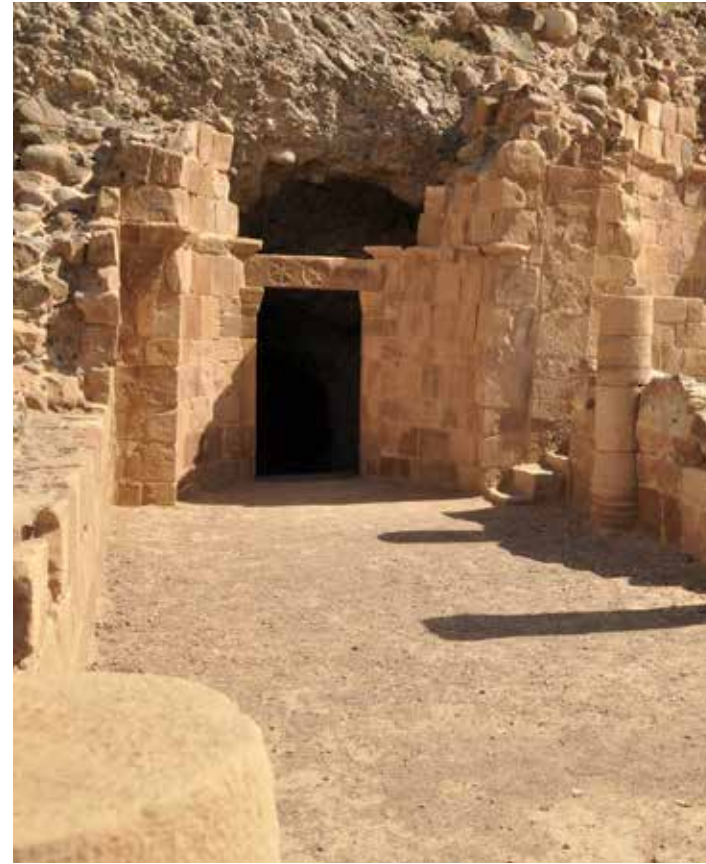
Luxuriate in the hot thermal springs at Hammat Zarqa Ma'in and Al-Himma and take time out to visit some of the area's historic places. Not far from the hot springs lie two sites linked by tradition to Herod the Great. One is the remains of a palace at Mukawir (Machærus), where Salome danced for the king and where John the Baptist was beheaded. King Herod was said to have bathed in the medicinal waters of the springs and people have come here for thermal treatments, or simply to enjoy a hot soak, since the days of Rome. There is also a go-karting spot in the area to satisfy your adrenaline rush.

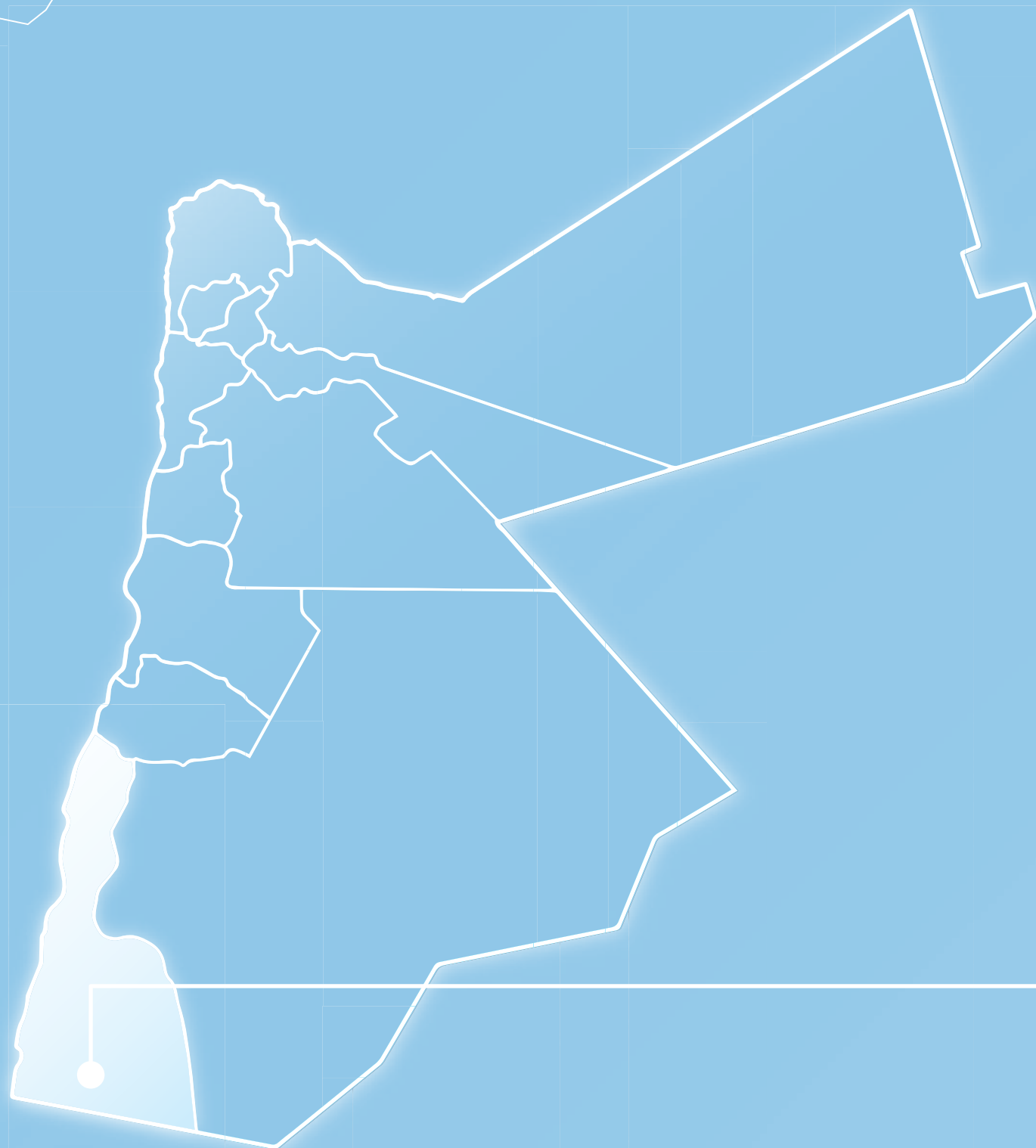

This was an important walled town for most of the Bronze and Iron Ages (536-3200 BC). It had a large caravanserai (inn) in the early Islamic period and is believed to be associated with the biblical sites of Zaphon and Zarthan.



Along the south east coast of the Dead Sea are the sites of Bab Ad-Dhraa and Numeira, both of which are plausible candidates for the biblical sites of Sodom and Gomorrah (in the Book of Genesis, God destroyed these places because He was displeased with the wickedness of the inhabitants). Bab Ad-Dhraa was inhabited for about 1000 years during the early Bronze Age. Nomads used this place as a cemetery, burying their dead in multiple shaft tombs and charnel houses. Numeira, 14km to the south, was a large hilltop walled town that lasted for around a century during the Early Bronze Age period. A 40cm layer of ash indicates that this ancient place suffered a fiery destruction.

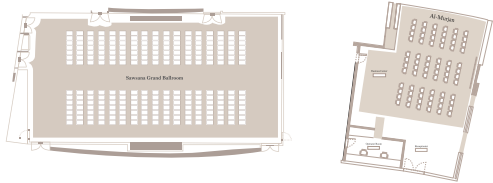

Souk by the Sea

The Queen Noor Al-Hussein Foundation

This street market takes place every Friday all year-round. It promotes handicrafts and goods produced by the people of Aqaba.

The Queen Noor Al-Hussein Foundation, which supports local craftspeople, supplies several outlets in Aqaba with a stunning selection of handmade clothing, carpets, cushion covers, wall-hangings, pottery and glassware.

Major Attractions



Wadi Rum
The striking red sandstone desert, celebrated for its Lawrence of Arabia fame, is certainly worth a trip while you are in Jordan. Wadi Rum is best experienced with an overnight trip, where you can take in the sunset and sunrise, spend the night in a traditional Bedouin tent and learn about the unique culture and hospitality of the wonderful people who live in this desert. The star-filled sky will leave you in awe.



Mamluk Castle
A short distance inland from the corniche on the Gulf of Aqaba, the Mamluk Castle is the site of one of the most famous battles of the First World War. Part of the Arab Revolt that swept through Aqaba in 1916, is immortalized in a memorable scene from David Lean's 1962 film Lawrence of Arabia. Before its occupation by the ousted Ottomans, this 16th century castle was built by the Mamluk sultanate and was used for centuries as a 'khan', or traveler's inn, hosting pilgrims on their southward journey to Mecca for the annual Hajj.



Fourth century Roman church
Archaeologists in Aqaba have unearthed what they believe to be the world's oldest church, from the late 3rd century AD. It is slightly older than the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem and the Church of Nativity in Bethlehem, both of which date to the 4th century. It has since been back-filled with earth for protection.



Aqaba Bird Observatory
As well as being a destination for tourists, Aqaba is the resting site for many migratory birds heading north up the Gulf of Aqaba each spring. Any tree, bush, dripping irrigation pipe, or pool of water is a welcome sight for a tired migrating bird

arriving from an exhausting flight over the sea or across the desert. There is a bird observatory in Aqaba where you can to glimpse some of the 390 species of birds that reside in Jordan or use it as an annual migratory stop.



Aqaba Archaeological Museum
This museum lies in the former house of Sharif Hussein bin Ali. It includes artefacts from excavated sites in the Aqaba district; they range in date from the mid 7th millennium BC to the beginning of the 12th century AD. Particularly important are the ceramic and steatite vessels excavated from Islamic Ayla.



Sherif al-Hussein bin Ali Mosque
Named after the leader of the Arab Revolt of 1916, and the present king's great grandfather, the grand Sherif al-Hussein bin Ali Mosque is the most remarkable place of worship in the city, and one of its most visually striking pieces of architecture.



Early Islamic Ayla
The ruins of Ayla are situated northwest of the present-day city center. The ruins are rather limited, especially when compared to other sites within Jordan, but the site holds a special place in the history of the Islamic world as one of its earliest cities and the first to be founded, in the 7th century, outside the Arabian Peninsula.

Food & Shopping

Within Wadi Musa are several restaurants that serve traditional cuisine. For a truly memorable night out there is the Petra Kitchen where, under the watchful eyes of local chefs, you and your fellow diners can prepare a traditional Arabic meal.

In addition to artisan stalls inside the Petra site, there are many shops in Wadi Musa that sell local products, such as Nabataean-style pottery, silverware and bead-work jewelry. These are mainly produced locally by the Bedouin people.



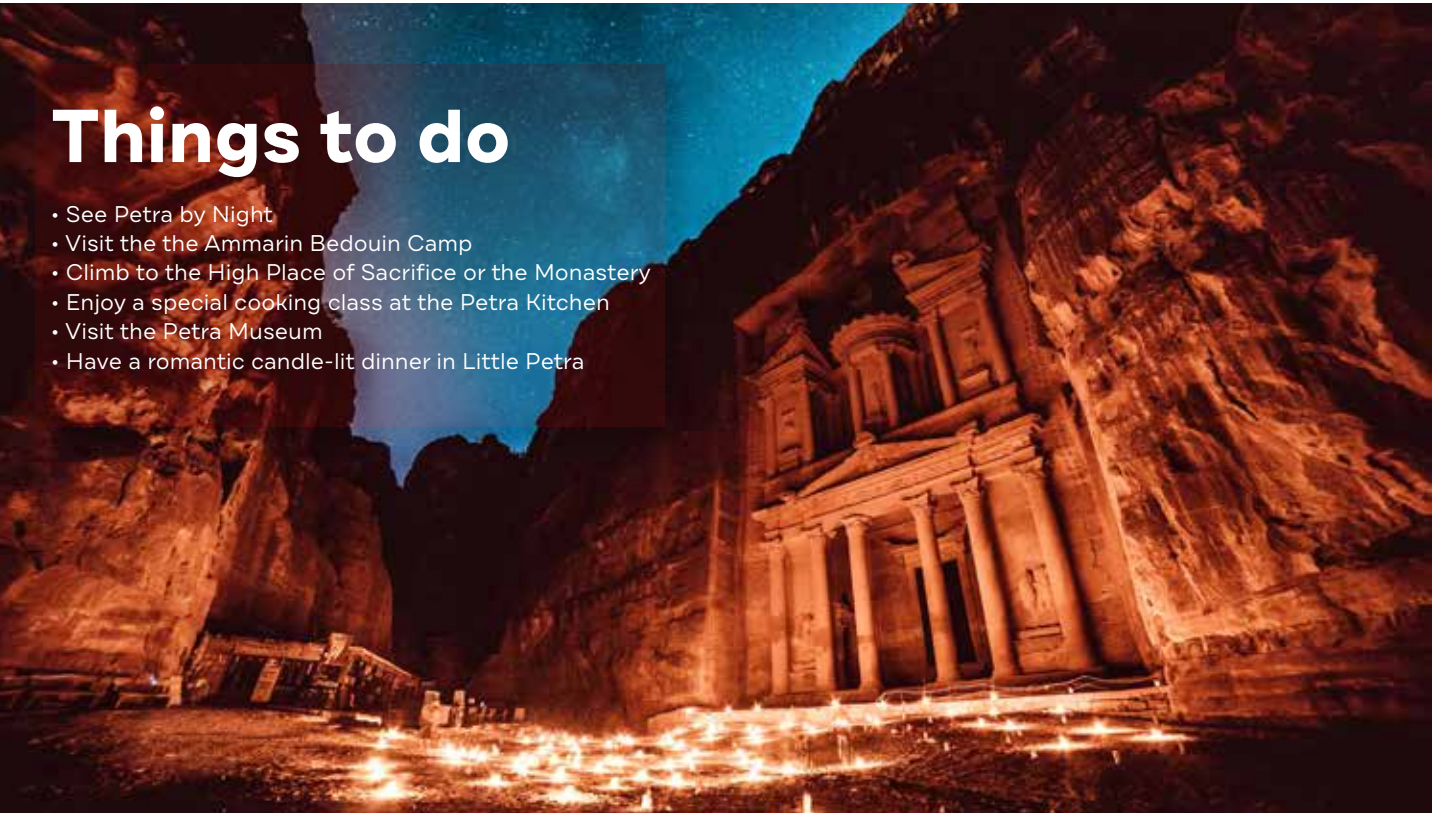
There is a silver workshop just outside the center of Wadi Musa, which is sponsored by the Queen Noor Foundation. There, the local women make a delightful array of silver jewelry pieces that are sold in several local shops. It is possible to visit the workshop, but it is always best to go there with an Arabic speaker as the ladies who work there don't speak English well, if at all. It is also possible to have a piece of jewelry custom-made but you will need to allow a few days for this. Prices are a little lower at the workshop than in town.

Also available in a few shops in Wadi Musa are the very heavy antique necklaces. These are not generally on display and are expensive.

There are two craft shops at the Visitor Center: one is run for the benefit of the Rural Women of Jordan and the other for the Ladies' Working Circle of Wadi Musa. Here you will find a good selection of items, particularly jewelry or boxes decorated in mother-of-pearl marquetry, brightly-colored hand-filled bottles of sand, woolen rugs, embroidered and woven pillows, fashion items, furniture, pottery, glass, wall hangings and metal work, as well as embroidered items of clothing. All of these make great gifts to take home as a memento of your stay in Jordan.

Major Attractions



The Neolithic village of Beidha (Little Petra)

This site is thought to have been occupied from 7200BC to 6500BC, which makes it one of the first settled villages in human history. Around that time the settlement burned down and was rebuilt. After its reconstruction, it was inhabited for a short while before being totally abandoned. Remains of the houses

and a retaining wall are still visible today. They are remnants of one of the first transitions from semi-settled nomads to settled villagers and the start of an agrarian economy. At the Beidha Neolithic site you can see scientific reconstructions of what the Neolithic dwellings may have looked like.



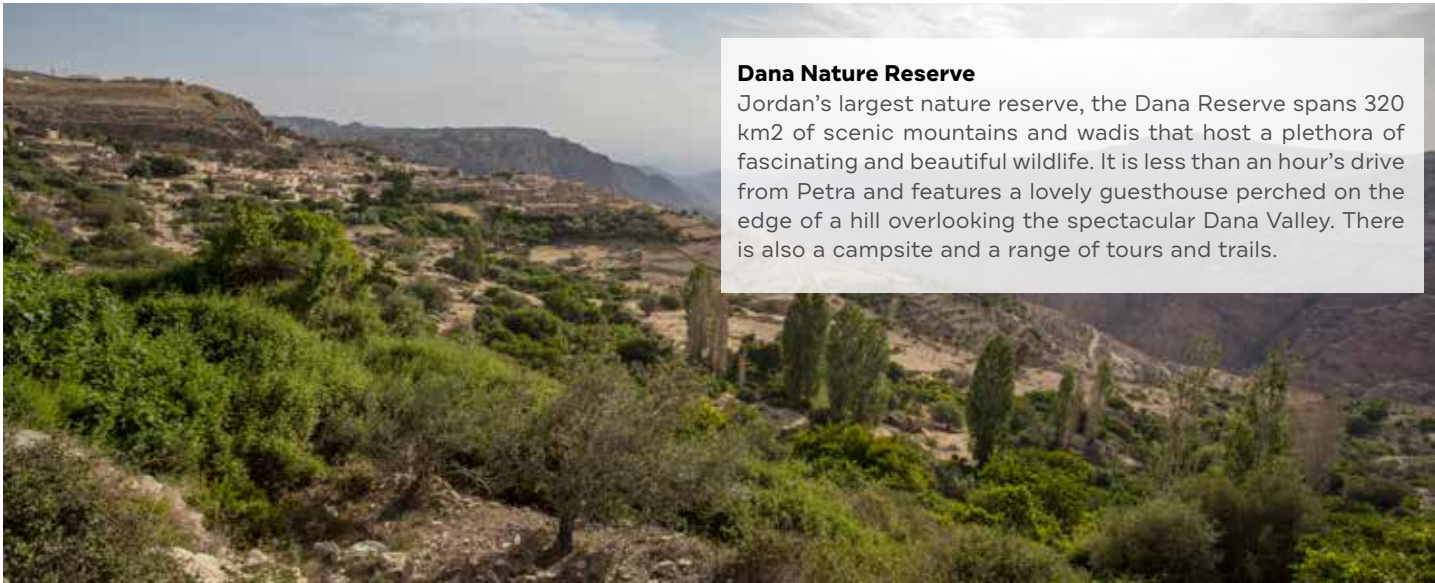
Shobak Castle

This impressive Crusader castle was built by Baldwin I of Jerusalem in 1115. It was originally called 'Krak de Montreal' or 'Mons Regalis' in honor of the king's contribution to its construction (Mont Royal). In its heyday, about 6000 people resided in the castle. It was attacked several times by Saladin and finally fell to him in 1189 after a two-year siege. The Mamluks restored the castle in the 14th century.



Aaron's Tomb

It is believed that Moses' brother Aaron died and was buried in the Petra area. A white-domed mosque, built in the 14th century, commemorates this. It stands atop Aaron's Mountain (Jabal Harun), which is the highest peak in the area at 1350 meters above sea level. It has long been a place of pilgrimage for the locals and is worth a trip if you have an extra day in Petra. Good physical fitness is required for the long hike there and back.



Dana Nature Reserve

Jordan's largest nature reserve, the Dana Reserve spans 320 km2 of scenic mountains and wadis that host a plethora of fascinating and beautiful wildlife. It is less than an hour's drive from Petra and features a lovely guesthouse perched on the edge of a hill overlooking the spectacular Dana Valley. There is also a campsite and a range of tours and trails.

Standing next to the Roman Amphitheatre, this 2nd century theatre would be perfect for smaller scale events.



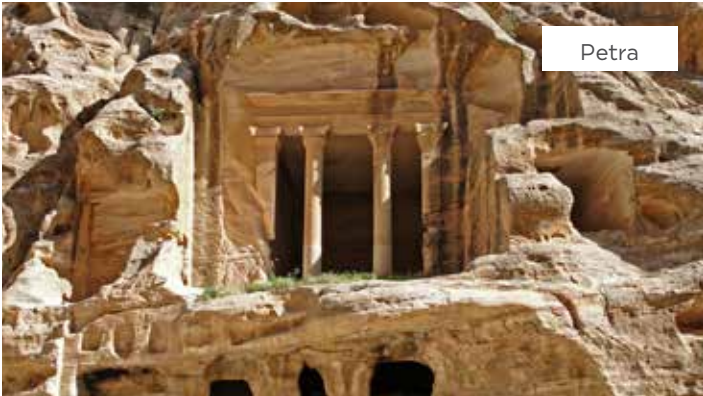
5. Jerash South Theatre and North Theatre

This famous landmark in Amman once seated 6000 spectators and is now used as a venue for cultural activities, performances, and concerts.



4. Little Petra

Capacity: 2500
Also known as Siq Al- Barid, this mini Nabataean Petra can serve as the ideal setting for a multitude of enchanted evening programs.



6. Ajloun Castle

Capacity: 1000
This historical 12th century castle is located in the beautiful north of Jordan. Situated on a hilltop overlooking three valleys, this fortress would be a grand setting for any event.



7. Umm Qais Amphitheatre

Capacity: 1500
The ancient city of Um Qais was renowned in its time as a cultural center and was home to several classical poets and philosophers. It boasts a brooding theater with incredible acoustics.



8. Aqaba Castle

Capacity: 800
This Mamluk fortress lies a short distance inland from the corniche on the Gulf of Aqaba. With a view of the great flag of the Arab revolt, this is an extraordinary site at which to hold your special event.



9. The Baptism Site Conference Center

Capacity: 350
The main conference hall of the Holy Baptism Site at the Dead Sea is a wonderful historical and spiritual site at which to hold your event.



10. Dead Sea Panoramic Complex

This complex offers some of the most spectacular views in the Kingdom. From the observation terrace you can enjoy breathtaking scenes over the Jordan Rift Valley and Dead Sea basin. The complex includes a museum, exhibition hall, conference hall, two interpretation booths, control room, pantry and storage foyer and courtyard. Hidden Gems

2. Azraq Wetland Reserve:
This reserve was created to preserve the precious oasis located in the heart of Jordan's Eastern desert.



6. Mujib Nature Reserve:
This wadi is fed by several rivers that flow through the surrounding mountains and canyons, the valley ends at the Dead Sea.



3. Dana Nature Reserve:
Jordan's largest reserve supports a huge variety of wildlife, including many rare species of plants and animals.



7. Shaumari Wildlife Reserve:
This is home to some of the rarest species of animals in the Middle East, including the beautiful Arabian oryx.



4. Dibeen Forest Reserve:
This forest includes some of the largest and oldest Aleppo pine trees in the kingdom.



8. Yarmouk Forest Reserve:
One of the most recently-established reserves, it protects a beautiful section of deciduous oak forest in Jordan.

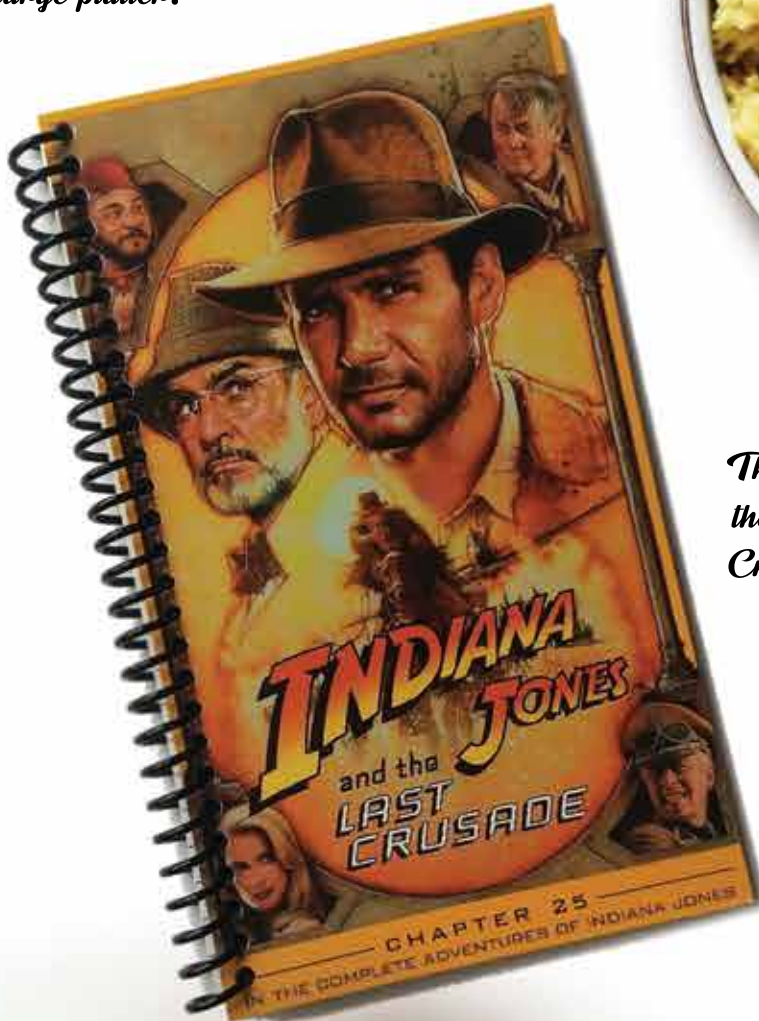
Fascinating Facts

Aqaba's reef is alive with the unmatched marvels and colors of its coral and fish. Common species found there are branch coral, fungi and montipora. There is also the rare Ancelia, a black, tree-like specimen found at great depths, which was first discovered by King Hussein himself.



Amman, the capital of Jordan, was once named Philadelphia after Ptolemy Philadelphus (283-246 BC) who rebuilt the city during his reign. Amman was later taken by Herod, around 30 BC, and fell under the influence of Rome.

Summers, which last from May through September, are hot and dry with temperatures averaging around 32 °C (90 °F). Winters in Jordan usually last from November to March. They are relatively cool with temperatures averaging 13 °C (55 °F). Winters also bring frequent showers and occasional snowfall in some western elevated areas of the country.
